Nicholas Ferrar lived at Little Gidding from 1624 until his death in 1637.

In those years he and his extended family lived a life of regular prayer, and of service to the community.

Hallowed by their lives and their prayers, Little Gidding was then as it is now, a quiet place, off the beaten track. The Friends of Little Gidding, founded by Alan Maycock in 1946, exist to help care for this place, and to celebrate the life and witness of Nicholas Ferrar. The Friends organize, each July, a pilgrimage to Little Gidding, the heart of which is prayers at Nicholas's tomb in front of the church.

Nicholas Ferrar is also commemorated with a service in Little Gidding Church each year on 4 December, the date of his death in 1637.

The Friends help the PCC in their task of caring for the building and adorning it, and in maintaining the area around the church to retain and enhance its beauty and sacredness; the Friends also help to maintain Ferrar House as a place of hospitality for visitors.

The poet and writer T S Eliot came to Little Gidding in May 1936 to visit the place where Nicholas Ferrar had lived.

A few years later, in the depths of the Second World War, he wrote his famous poem 'Little Gidding' exploring the relationship between time and eternity.

Eliot was vice-president of the Friends from 1946 until his death in 1965. In 2006, to commemorate the seventieth anniversary of his visit, the Friends sponsored the first Eliot Festival at Little Gidding, an event honoured by the presence of the poet's widow, Mrs Valerie Eliot (pictured, top right). In 2007 the second Festival was held, jointly organized with the new T S Eliot Society, a mixture of scholarly talks, poetry reading, and an acclaimed musical concert inspired by the place and the poem.

The work of maintaining and enhancing Little Gidding and honouring the memory of Nicholas Ferrar continues. It needs time, money and continued prayers.
